Members of the Legislature in these positions rarely sponsor legislation and do not sign letters to themselves. As such, it is difficult for them to earn points in the system we have designed for our scorecard so they are not included. It should be noted that other members of leadership often choose not to file legislation as well, so their scores, in some cases, may be lower than their colleagues for that reason.
